Sir,

Before delving into the concerns in respect of the cited subject, I would like to convey our thanks to you that EPFO undertook the task of effecting long pending transfers in such challenging times and saw it through.

In this regard, EOTC very aptly completed the momentous work of going through the preferences, choices, and requests made by around 500 officers and then allocating them the commensurate place of posting as per the available vacancies and vacancies created due to the ongoing process of transfers.

Therefore, it is very reasonable to acknowledge that instances of natural omissions and commissions may so happen to cause few very genuine and authentic requests and concerns of the officer to escape the due consideration by the concerned.

As a body representative of the officers of EPFO, it was sincerely felt that cases of transfers, of individuals with certain circumstances worth giving due weightage while considering his transfer posting as per criteria set by the DoPT guidelines and different judgements of honourable Courts, somehow escaped the consideration are required to be drawn attention towards, for necessary action and early disposal.

As per specific instructions by DoPT in respect of cases:

- (i) Where both the spouse are working No. 28034/9/2009-Estt. (A) Dt. 30.09.2009
- (ii) Where government servant is Physically Handicapped No.14017/16/2002-Estt. (RR) Dt. 13.03.02
- (iii) Where government servant has specially-abled children- No.A-B 14017/41/90-Estt. (RR) 10.05.90

&

(iv) In respect of cases where person has turned into single parent to its child and cases of severe medical condition in the light of very specific adjudications by High Court of Madras in case of B.Edward Vedanayagam vs The Secretary To Government of Tamil Nadu on 9 April, 2015 adjudicated in clear terms, "When an employee pleads that he underwent two heart surgeries (case of severe medical condition), the same could be considered as a ground for transfer", it is earnestly requested to consider these cases, with significantly sensible and humane stipulations, representations for which has already been forwarded by respective officers through proper channel.
